

CIBC 4-H Post-Secondary Education Scholarships

Through the generosity of CIBC, eight scholarships – each valued at \$1,000 – are available across Canada to 4-H members who plan to pursue a post-secondary education in the field of agriculture, engineering, arts, science, business or health in September 2017.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be at least 16 years of age by January 1, 2017 and a current 4-H member in good standing.
- Applicants must be Canadian residents in their final year of high school or CEGEP and planning to attend college or university in September 2017. Applicants must be pursuing education in an agriculture, engineering, arts, science, business or health program.
- Complete the online application at <http://apply.4-h-canada.ca> and include the following:
 - Upload one reference letter from your community, school or 4-H leader.
 - Upload a letter of offer or acceptance to a full-time program in a Canadian college or university.
 - Provide background on your 4-H and community involvement.
 - Provide background on how this scholarship will benefit you.
 - A 500-word essay (include word count) on one of following two topics:
 - *Why is it important to support young people from diverse and underserved communities?*
 - *Why is environmental education important?*
 - *How can post-secondary education be more accessible?*
- Winners must agree to provide a photograph, proof of acceptance and their social insurance number to claim their award. Funds will not be released and announcements will not be made until these documents are provided.
- Applicants must grant permission to CIBC and 4-H Canada to use their name, photograph, province of residence, school and area of study in publications and online communication channels that promote the CIBC 4-H Canada Scholarship program.

Selection Criteria

Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee and judged on the following criteria:

- Ability to follow instructions and meet deadlines
- Quality of the essay submitted
- Reference letter provided
- 4-H involvement (including number of years, positions held and projects completed)
- Community involvement
- Confirmation of current good standing in a Canadian 4-H club
- Answer to the question “How will this scholarship benefit you in achieving your educational goals?”

In the event of a tie, winners will be selected by a random draw.



Online applications - Applications open at 10:00 a.m. on March 1, 2017 and must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. EST on May 31, 2017.

Winners will be notified in July 2017 and public announcements will be made in August.
