Delegates explore and develop skills related to civic engagement, governance, parliamentary procedures, citizenship, and politics.

In 2021, we will be exploring issues of income security and public programs with our theme, **Examining Public Programs: Exploring the issue of Universal Basic Income**

Citizenship Congress creates multiple opportunities for delegates to network and learn from experts on governance and civic engagement while fostering their research skills, public speaking skills and expanding their knowledge on parliamentary procedure as they prepare for the annual Citizenship Congress debate.

What to Expect

Each delegate must attend at least **ONE** debate prep session but are encouraged to attend as many sessions as possible.

The conference will officially open on Friday evening, the annual debate will take place on Saturday and we will end with workshops and a closing activity on Sunday.

This year's debate resolution is "Be it resolved that the Government of Canada will provide a guaranteed basic income for all Canadian citizens over the age of 18."
