4-H in Finland

The Finnish 4H Federation - or "Suomen 4H-Liitto" - officially formed as an organization in 1928. It has more than 70,000 members, aged 8 to 28, and close to 3,000 clubs. 4-H in Finland has a presence in both rural and urban areas, and plays an active role in providing employment opportunities for youth through its "Three Steps to Employment" approach.

- be part of numerous popular, community-based, Finnish events and activities
- work on family farms, do farm chores, and tour local agricultural operations
